

Lucky Craft Hot Colors Available Locally!!!

About 5 years ago the Lucky Craft regional pro staffers took a poll on their favorite colors. These are guys from just about every state. The resounding winners were chartreuse shad and ghost minnow. No matter what style bait, the pro staffers from around the country had these colors on their list. In 2009, Lucky Craft came out with two new colors that morphed the ever-popular chartreuse shad and ghost minnow finishes.

The Ghost Chartreuse Shad is basically a translucent version of the original Chartreuse shad color, but with a twist. It also has a white, reflective center. It's hard to see in photos, but trust me it's there. So while you are working the Ghost chartreuse shad it delivers a tiny bit of flash (working a walking bait or jerkbait), but when it stops, it's the translucent chartreuse shad color. I really like this color and is a safe bet in clear water situations when you can't decide to go with a more white or clear/translucent color for your baits.

Phantom Chartreuse Shad



This color was designed by Gary Doby's and was originally for the Staysee 90 Version 3, but is offered in many of Lucky Craft baits. In fact, the color and bait were so popular in the NW that the distributors sold out of all of their pre-orders months in advance of getting them. Heck, us pro staffers couldn't get them until late 2009. This color has more of a pale-green fish scale pattern on top, with a faint chartreuse stripe on the side and almost completely transparent belly/sides. This is a great color for the

ultra clear bodies of water. Sometimes, the subtle differences in color and transparency are all that is needed to get those fish to commit to the lure instead following behind “investigating” it.
