

Here are the most common questions that folks have been asking about Four Corners Team Bass and Angler's Choice and the corresponding answers.

What off-limits regulations are you going to have? None. There are no off-limits in Team Bass.

Did Angler's Choice take over Team Bass? No. Team Bass is now an Angler's Choice Circuit. However, Angler's Choice did not purchase or take over Team Bass, nor will the folks in Angler's Choice tell us how to run Team Bass.

Are you going to run two circuits at the same time – Angler's Choice and Team Bass – and if so can we join one and not the other? No. Team Bass is an AC circuit. There will only be one set of tournaments. Your \$40 membership is the only membership you have to purchase and it includes a subscription to BassWest Magazine.

Are you going to have all those side pots like Angler's Choice has had in the past? No. We aren't going to have "lucky this" or "looser that" pots only an optional big bass pot and maybe the occasional pike pot.

What are the entry fees? Each tournament costs \$150 per team with a \$10 big bass pot.

Why are you having tournaments on Sunday and are they two-day tournaments? To make up for postponed Morgan tourneys, and no each day is a separate tournament.

Whose rules are you going to use, Team Bass or Angler's Choice? Mostly Team Bass with a couple of notable exceptions. A person may now fish by him/herself to represent a team, and we will use points and weight to determine standings.

Are you going to have the Team Bass Championship? Yes. It will be the same – top 10 teams plus 5 Last Chance teams.

Are the payouts going to be the same as they have been? Yes. If we average the same number of boats, then the payouts will be comparable.

Team Bass has always been a fun circuit with relatively low entry fees and great pay back (over 100%) thanks to our wonderful sponsors. It is going to be the same this year. Now, our top anglers and those who fish all 7 tourneys will be able to go to Angler's Choice Tournament of Champions at Lake Mead in September and compete for a Legend boat with a Mercury motor. So, if you liked Team Bass in the past, you will still like it because it will be essentially the same as it has been for the past several years. If you did not like Team Bass in the past, you probably still won't like it. Hope this answers some of those questions that many anglers have. Give me call if you need more info.
